

Arrivals

As of August 2021, with the withdrawal of the US military from Afghanistan, the State Department approved 34,500 Special Immigrant Visas for persons in Afghanistan who assisted the military, to protect those individuals and their families from being targeted by the Taliban. As of this week, Washtenaw County has welcomed 300 of those SIV recipients since the very first family's arrival in Ypsilanti on October 4th. There has been a pause on regular refugee resettlement due to the influx of SIV families, but as of this week, regular refugee resettlement has resumed, with the arrival of two families (six individuals) this week. There are six more refugee families with arrivals scheduled the first week of March (18 individuals). There will be a second wave of 150 more SIV families from Afghanistan arriving in Washtenaw County between March and June, along with regular refugee resettlement. We appreciate your support and assistance in helping welcome these families to our communities!
