#### Civil Surgeon support

WRW is exploring how we can help refugees who have been in the US for more than one year apply for their permanent residency in the USA. A major barrier is the medical exam that each family member must undergo to get a green card. These exams must be performed by a civil surgeon and local cost is a minimum of \$400 per person (not covered by insurance). This is far more than most of our families can afford, especially families with multiple children. We are looking for a physician who would be willing to work with WRW to become certified and perform exams at a discounted rate. # Resettlement Update

In 2023 so far there have been around 300 individuals who arrived in Washtenaw County (over 100 cases), and there are still 59 more (16 families) that should arrive by October 1 (end of the fiscal year), with around 140 individuals in the pipeline to arrive in months to come. Next year's capacity has been set at 450 so about the same as this year's, and the main countries have been Somalia, Ukraine, Yemen, Palestine, Syria, Guatemala, Iraq, Burma, El Salvador, Eritrea, Afghanistan, DRC, Colombia, Venezuela, Pakistan, and Iran.
